- Develop challenging learning activities, including the curation of appropriate teaching materials and resources to support curriculum goals.
- Collaborate with Chair of Faculty, teachers and curriculum leaders to ensure consistency and progression across year levels.
- Actively engage students in the learning process.
- Fully utilise a wide variety of teaching resources and technologies available within the School community.
- Engage students in assessment and evaluation processes and techniques.
- Actively engage with students and their families in relation to student learnings and performance.

Pastoral Care and Co-curricular

- Reflect and uphold the values of the School at all times and take an active role in the general life of the School.
- In collaboration with teachers, Co-Heads of Years and Student Care and Wellbeing staff, observe and support students' emotional, social, and mental health needs, following up as required.

- Foster a classroom culture that promotes respect, inclusion, and safety for all students.
- Actively engage with pastoral and other co-curricular activities, including rostered supervisory duties around the School grounds, after school sports and camps.
